### BON ACCORD - HAZELHEAD

#### LARGE MODELS

As we appear to be getting more adventurous building larger models, both glider and power, it is worth remembering that any model weighing more than 5kg (including fuel etc) requires a CAA exemption certificate. Please remember it is your responsibility to check the weight of your model and obtain a certificate if required. Failure to do so would almost certainly invalidate your insurance. This could lead to prosecution for Criminal negligence in the event of an accident.

Graham Philip has recently obtained a certificate for his Big Lift and says that the proceedure is simple. So, if anyone needs a certificate and is not sure how to get it, I suggest they contact Graham (O.K. Graham ?!).
